Kindergarten

This week we began our safety lessons. There are two things we focus on: ways to stay safe and always ask first. Students hear about the Never-Never Rule of things they should never ever do which includes: NEVER... touch guns, play with fire, ride on wheels without a helmet, go into water without an adult, use sharp tools without help, ride in a car without your seatbelt, touch an animal without asking permission, cross a street without looking, and keep secrets about touching. Encourage your child to share the Never-Never rules!

4th Grade

We are continuing to work on what students can do when they recognize bullying behaviors as a bystander. We practiced ways that students can be upstanders and do something that helps the targeted student. For example, they could...

- stand up for the targeted student
- say something to support the target
- help get the target away from the situation
- report the bullying to a trusted adult
- refuse to join in anything mean

Last, we talked about having empathy for others. Encourage your student to **say** something if they **see** something. We want a culture of kindness and acceptance.


2nd Grade

This week in CCI we have been working our safety unit. We will be covering two things in this session: recognizing what's safe/unsafe and to always ask an adult first.
